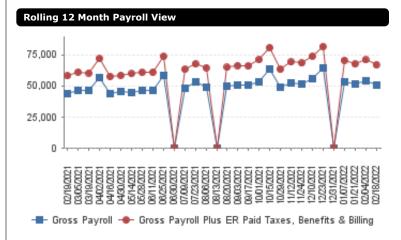

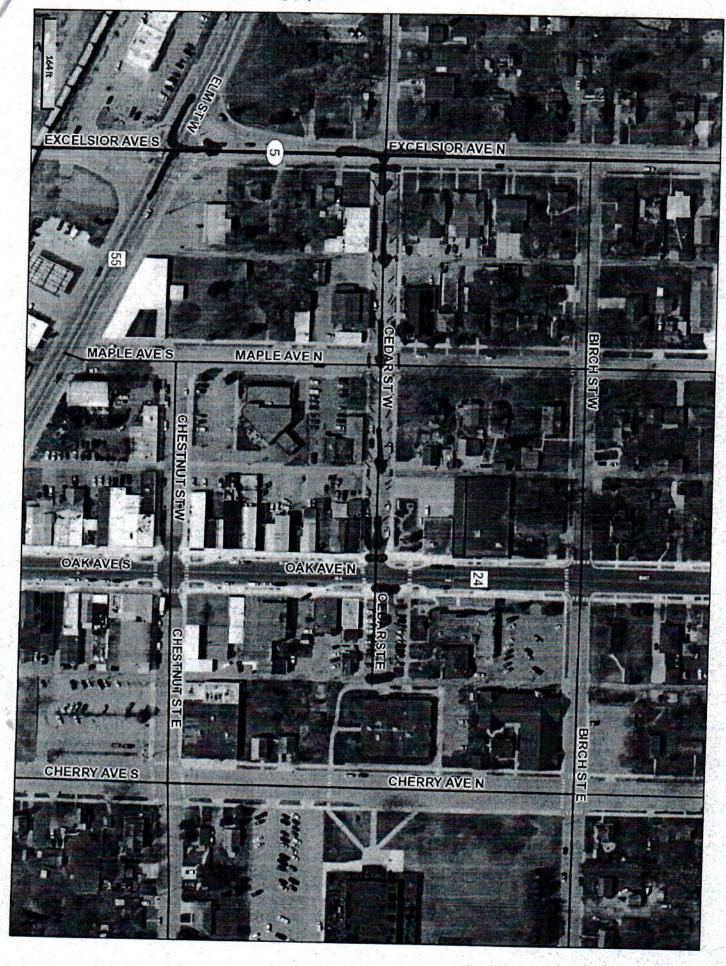

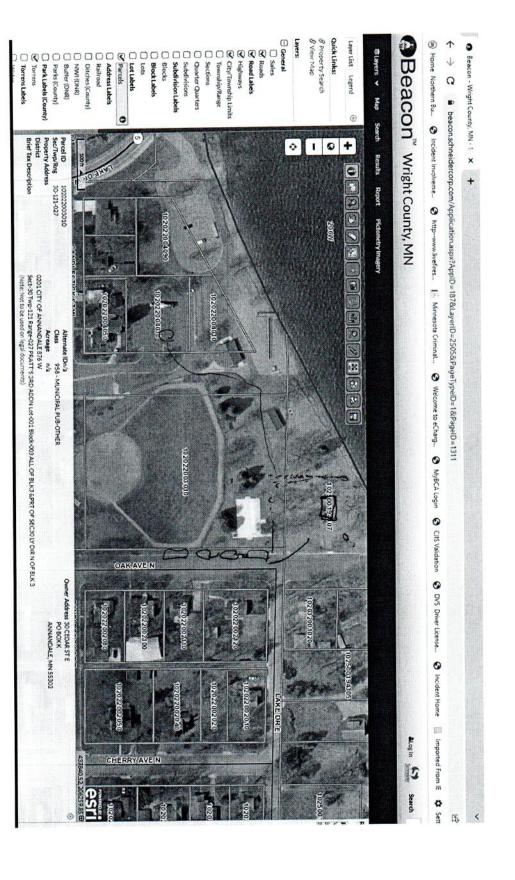

BACKGROUND

Chapter 91 and related Chapters: Animals – Chickens in residential districts:

At the request of the Planning Commission and City Council due to increased requests, a draft ordinance to allow chickens in residential districts is attached to the staff report. The ordinance closely reflects the draft ordinance that was presented during a public hearing on November 28, 2017. The draft ordinance creates an annual licensing program to allow residential properties to have up to four hens enclosed in an accessory building or containment area on their property.

PLANNING COMMISSION REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION:

Planning Commission reviewed the request to allow chickens in residential districts and held a Public Hearing on April 5, 2022.

Public comment was received from Samantha Bordak, 901 Morrison Avenue, who expressed interest in approving the ordinance amendment. No other public comments or letters were received.

The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the draft ordinance as presented.

Section 151.09: Public Land Dedication

Park Dedication Ordinances are intended to allow for the City to expand the park system based on new developments. State Statutes allow for this to ensure that new development provides parkland based on its impacts to the park system. Currently the City requires 600 square feet of parkland per new unit.

Other Area Ordinances

Maple Lake requires 10% of the land for residential development. They also require 5% of land for non-residential development. The cash-in-lieu amount is 10% or 5% of the value of the land. This is a common ordinance in the state.

Monticello requires 11% of all residential plats to be dedicated as park land. The cash-in-lieu

amount is 11% of the value of the land.

Buffalo uses a formula of 1 acre for 75 people in a development. There is a formula for the calculation of the number of people which includes 3.5 people per single family lot, 3 per twinhome unit, and 1 per apartment bedroom. They use a fee of \$2900 per unit for cash-in-lieu.

On a 100 acre property that was platted with 250 single family units and 100 two bedroom apartments, Annandale would require the dedication of 4.8 acres of parkland (350 x 600 square feet = 210,000 square feet = 4.8 acres). Maple Lake would require 10 acres of parkland. Monticello would require 11. Buffalo would require 14.

Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment would result in Annandale requiring 10% of the land, which would fit more with the City's adopted park and trail plans.

The ordinance also specifies that when cash-in-lieu of land is requested by the City Council that the value of the cash is either the demonstrated 10% cash value of the land or another amount as determined by the City in the fee schedule.

PLANNING COMMISSION REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION:

The Planning Commission reviewed the request for ordinance amendment to Public Land Dedication and held a public hearing on April 5, 2022. No public comment was received. Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the rezonings as presented.

Section 150.48 and 150.49: Residential Performance Standards & Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards

City Staff has been reviewing the performance standards within the Zoning Ordinance and has found several areas where there is outdated language or difficult to implement sections. This ordinance is intended to correct these issues.

Proposed Amendments

Section 1 – *Garage Standards:* This section is renamed from "garage sizes" to "garage standards" as there are more standards involved that just the size of the garage (i.e. garage door height). The amendment includes clarifying that no garage may exceed the size of the house, there can be no more than one attached and one detached garage per lot, all garages must have a driveway for access (no driving over yards), and that garages cannot exceed the height of the house.

Section 2 *Roofs*: The amendment under the section related to roofs is to prohibit metal roofs. The existing language states that fasteners must be concealed, and this is difficult to enforce.

Section 3 – *Apartment Trash Enclosures:* This section states that trash enclosures for apartment buildings must meet the same standards for commercial uses (screened, accessible).

Section 4 - Fences: The amendment in this part includes adding the statement that says fences must be residential in nature and lists the common types of residential fences. Some cities go further and state that chain link fences cannot be in the front yard.

Section 5 – *Commercial/Industrial Exterior Finishes:* This section expands the list of permitted exterior finishes for commercial/industrial uses to include more options like fiber cement board and EFIS. The list excludes metal buildings from commercial districts but metal is still permitted in industrial. It references the Downtown Plan for C-1 buildings.

Section 6 – *Facing Requirement:* The facing requirement is related to what percent of the front of industrial buildings must be non-metal. The current ordinance requires 75% of the front and 30% of all visible sides. The City has not strictly enforced this standard in the past. Therefore, it is recommended that the City use 30% on the front be non-metal and the non-metal portion be one of the decorative options like brick or stone.

Section 7 – *Commercial/Industrial Accessory Buildings:* There is no current limit on the size of commercial and industrial accessory buildings. This could cause a "loophole" in the ordinance regarding one principal structure per lot. It is common for cities to limit the size of accessory structures to a specific number (one or two) and a percentage of the size of the principal use. Thirty percent is a very common standard and it used in the ordinance draft.

Section 8 – *Commercial/Industrial Landscaping:* The City has been getting landscaping plans that ignore the perimeter of the building. Therefore, there is language added to address this in this section.

Section 9 – *Screening/Exterior Storage*: This section is added to remove the existing language for trash enclosures.

Section $10 - Trash\ Enclosures$: The previous section was amended due to the inclusion of this section. This sets standards for trash enclosures.

Section 11 – Commercial/Industrial Fences: Material standards for fences were included.

Section 12 – *Parking in the C-1 District:* The addition of this section is to clarify that within the C-1 District parking is not required to be provided, as it is intended to be provided by the public parking lots and on-street parking. Residential units still need to provide parking, however.

PLANNING COMMISSION REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION:

The Planning Commission reviewed the request for ordinance amendments to residential and commercial/industrial performance standards and held a public hearing on April 5, 2022. No public comment was received.

Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the rezonings with the exception of Section 2 – Roofs. They understood the difficulty of enforcing the current ordinance but wanted to continue allowing metal roofs in residential districts. They requested stronger language be added to this section to ensure fasteners are truly concealed if a metal roof is installed. This item would be brought to the May Planning Commission meeting for consideration.

Chapter 152 Natural Resource Protection

There have been some difficulties implementing the Natural Resources Protection Ordinance. The tree preservation standards include a confusing distinction between mature and young woodlands. The standards for replacement were more severe for less wooded lots, as well. Also of note, there were standards that were duplicitous with the Shoreland Ordinance. The following amendments are proposed.

Proposed Amendments

Section 1 - Application Requirements: The current ordinance includes a "walkthrough" requirement. This has been changed to the applicant providing a plan.

Section 2 - Definitions: Definitions of terms that are no longer to be used in this ordinance are deleted.

Section 3 - Exclusions: This section was modified to state that the terms of the tree preservation ordinance only applies to larger, residential subdivisions.

Section 4 – *Protection Standards:* This section includes the requirement of 30% tree preservation and a 30 foot wetland setback.

Section 5 – *Mitigation:* This includes the tree replacement formulas.

Section 6 - Deletions: This includes deletions of sections that are no longer needed in the ordinance.

PLANNING COMMISSION REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION:

Planning Commission reviewed the request to amend the Natural Resources Protection Ordinance and held a Public Hearing on April 5, 2022.

Public comment was received from Samantha Bordak, 901 Morrison Avenue, who asked how the protection of significant trees of 8 inches DBH was determined. It was explained that was an average of what other cities have for tree protection ordinances. No other public comments or letters were received.

The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval of the draft ordinance as presented.

CITY OF ANNANDALE COUNTY OF WRIGHT STATE OF MINNESOTA

ORDINANCE NO. 388

AN ORDINANCE REVISING CHAPTER 91, SECTION 91.05 OF THE CITY CODE REGARDING THE LIMITED KEEPING OF CHICKENS

The Council of the City of Annandale, Minnesota does hereby ordain:

Section 1. The City Council of the City Annandale hereby amends Chapter 91 of the City Code and amends to read as follows:

Section 91.05 Limited Keeping of Chickens

- (A) *Conditions*. The limited keeping of chickens may be permitted as an accessory use to a legally established single family residence subject to the following:
 - (1) The property shall be occupied with a single-family home. The owner of the chickens shall live in the dwelling on the property and the property owner is in receipt of a permit as required by this Ordinance.
 - (2) No person shall keep more than four total hen chickens.
 - (3) No person shall keep roosters or adult male chickens.
 - (4) Chickens shall be kept within a separate enclosed accessory building and/or fenced outdoor containment area subject to the following:
 - a. The accessory building shall be less than 120 square feet in size and not exceed six (6) feet in height.
 - b. The accessory building shall comply with all setbacks and other standards for accessory buildings, unless otherwise stated herein.
 - c. Any outdoor containment areas shall be screened from view from all neighboring properties and right-of-ways. Outdoor containment areas shall not exceed 20 feet per bird and shall not have a fenced enclosure greater than six (6) feet in height.
 - d. Any accessory building or containment area shall be located in the rear yard only and shall be at least 50 feet from adjacent habitable structures on neighboring properties.
 - e. Fencing used to contain chickens shall comply with applicable conditions of the City Code.
 - f. Chickens shall not be kept within the dwelling unit or garage.

- g. The accessory building and/or containment area shall be maintained in good repair, in a clean and sanitary manner, free of vermin, and free of objectionable odors.
- h. Chickens shall remain in the accessory building and/or containment area at all times and shall not run at large.
- i. Chickens shall remain in the accessory building from sunset to sunrise each day to prevent nuisance noise and the attraction of vermin and predators.
- j. Accessory building for the purpose of this ordinance shall not count towards the one accessory building as stated in Section _____ but are subject to the size limitations.
- (5) The slaughter of chickens on site is prohibited.
- (6) The raising of chickens for breeding purposes is prohibited.
- (7) The sale of eggs or other commercial activity on the premises is prohibited.
- (8) Feces and discarded feed shall be regularly collected and only stored temporarily on site in a leak-proof container with a tight-fitting cover to prevent nuisance odors and the attraction of vermin. Such waste shall not be composted on site.
- (9) Chicken feed shall be stored in leak-proof containers with a tight-fitting cover to prevent attracting vermin.
- (10) Cockfighting is prohibited.
- (B) Application for and Issuance of a Chicken Permit. Any person desiring to keep and maintain chickens under this section shall first obtain a Chicken Permit from the City of Annandale. The applicant for the permit shall live on the parcel, have an ownership interest in the parcel for which the permit is sought, or have a possessory interest as a renter or otherwise. If the applicant is not the owner of the parcel, the owner shall join in the application as a co-applicant.
 - (1) The individual applicant(s) represent, act on behalf of, and bind all occupants of the parcel. The applicant(s) are responsible for assuring compliance with the terms and limitations of this section.
 - (2) The City of Annandale shall create a written application form that seeks information relevant to this section including the number of chickens that will be maintained on the parcel and the method for handling and disposal of chicken manure and waste.
 - (3) All property owners within 50 feet of the property being proposed shall sign-off on the application in order to be considered for approval.

- (4) The permit shall be valid for a period of 12 months from the date of issuance. Each property is eligible for one permit every 12 months. Permits may be denied or revoked if the applicant has failed to comply with the terms of this section.
- (5) Only one permit per dwelling may be issued.
- (6) Applicant shall pay the fee as set forth in the fee schedule.
- (7) The applicant shall verify that he/she has read and is familiar with the terms and limitations of this section, and agrees to comply therewith.
- (8) Permits are non-transferable and do not run with the parcel.
- (9) The permit is a limited privilege, and is subject to denial or revocation for failure or inability to comply with this ordinance or with state or federal law or regulations, or for other reasons in the best interest of the City. The issuance of the permit does not create a vested zoning right in any person or in the property.
- (10) Any one denied a permit or renewal thereof, or whose permit is revoked, may file with the City Clerk a written request for a hearing before the City Council on the denial or revocation. The City Council shall hold a hearing within thirty (30) days of filing the request.
- **Section 2.** The remaining ordinance sections shall be recodified and renumbered.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be placed into effect upon passage and publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 389

AMENDING THE SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE REGARDING PARK DEDICATION

The Council of the City of Annandale, Minnesota does hereby ordain:

Section 1. Annual Zoning Ordinance Section 151.09 Subd. 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subd. 2. <u>Dedication Required</u>.

- A. In every plat, re-plat, or subdivision (including minor subdivisions) of land allowing for development for residential purposes, there shall be dedicated land for parks, playgrounds, public open spaces, trails, or other public uses and/or a cash contribution to the City's park dedication fund roughly related to the anticipated effect of the subdivision on the City's park and trail system. The requirement may also be met with a combination of land and cash or land, cash, and improvements, if approved by the City Council.
- B. In all new residential subdivisions, 10% of the area subdivided shall be dedicated for public space. The 10% shall be calculated on the gross area of the land being subdivided.
- C. The City Council shall not accept for credit against a subdivider's park dedication requirement any of the following:
 - 1. Delineated wetlands;
 - 2. Land within a designated floodplain;
 - 3. Land encumbered by a utility easement such as a petroleum or electric power transmission line (except where such easement is a standard platting requirement of the city and where the city determines that the land within the easement will be usable for park, trail, or open space purposes); or
 - 4. Land within a drainage easement or other land required for stormwater treatment.

Section 2. Annual Example 2 Annual Example 2 Annual Example 2 Annual Example 2 Section 151.09 Subd. 5 C is hereby amended to read as follows:

C. In accordance with state statutes, where the City Council determines that the park dedication requirements shall be paid in a cash contribution, the amount of the contribution shall be based on the market value of the raw land not later than at the time of final plat. Said value shall be determined by a determination of fair market

value as evidenced by an arms-length purchase agreement, an appraisal, or other method approved by the City Council. Such evidence is not considered definitive, but shall be a component of the City's determination of value. The subdivider or developer may, at their sole expense, submit alternative appraisal evidence of such value. The City Council shall make the final determination of value. As an alternative to the value determination, the city may, by ordinance, establish a fee per residential unit that will meet the cash dedication requirement. The determination of the appropriate fee calculation shall be made by the City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 390

AMENDING PERFORMANCE STANDARDS WITHIN THE ZONING ORDINANCE

The Council of the City of Annandale, Minnesota does hereby ordain:

Section 1. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.48, Residential Performance Standards, Building Standards, "Maximum Garage Size" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Garage Standards: Garages used or intended for storage of automobiles shall be accessed by a concrete or bituminous driveway. Garages may not exceed 1200 square feet of gross area. Total garage area may exceed 1200 square feet by conditional use. In no case shall any such structure exceed the area of the building footprint of the house residential/dwelling unit and no such structure may exceed 25% of the total area of the rear yard. No access door or other opening may exceed the height of 10 feet. In no case shall there be more than one attached and one detached garage. Apartment building multi-family garage structures may exceed the standards related to size and number to provide the minimum required number of garage stalls. Garages may not exceed the height of the principal structure.

Section 2. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.48, Residential Performance Standards, Building Standards, "Roofs" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Roofs: Roofs shall be constructed only of commercial grade asphalt shingles, wood shingles, slate, tile, or copper. For all roofing, a minimum roof slope of 4/12 and a minimum 12 inch soffit are required.

Section 3. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.48, Residential Performance Standards, Exterior Storage/Screening/Fences, "Screening/Exterior Storage" is hereby amended to include the following sentence:

Trash enclosures for multi-family apartment structures shall meet the standards required for trash enclosures in commercial zoning districts.

Section 4. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.48, Residential Performance Standards, Exterior Storage/Screening/Fences, "Fences" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fences: Fences shall not exceed 4 feet in height in front yards and 6 feet in height in other yards in any residential district. Fences shall be located not less than 18 inches from any lot line, except that fences may be located on the property line with written permission from the adjoining property owner, and except that a 3 foot setback is required from any street or alley right of way. Fences shall be residential in nature, such as chain link, wrought iron, vinyl, split rail, or board and picket.

Section 5. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards, Building Standards, "Exterior Finishes" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Exterior Finishes: The primary exterior building wall finishes shall consist of materials comparable in grade and quality to the following: brick; stone, natural and textured cast stone; concrete masonry with integral color and texture (such as split rock faced concrete block) or with exterior surfaces that have been treated with a decorative applied, surface texture, and color other than paint; cast in place concrete or pre-cast concrete panels; wood, provided the surfaces are finished for exterior use or wood of proven exterior durability is used, such as cedar, redwood, or cypress; concrete composite board or fiber cement board; glass; stucco; or Exterior Insulated Finishing Systems (EIFS) where the EIFS system is manufactured to replicate the look of approved building materials.

In the C-1 District, building materials shall be consistent with the requirements of the Downtown Plan.

In industrial districts, curtain wall panels of steel, fiberglass and aluminum (nonstructural, nonload bearing), provided such panels are factory fabricated and finished with a durable nonfade surface and their fasteners are of a corrosion resistant design, and architectural metal panel systems may also be used as an exterior building finish.

Section 6. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards, Building Standards, "Facing Requirement" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Facing Requirement: In industrial districts, the street facing front façade of all buildings shall not be more than 70% metal exterior finishes. A minimum of 30% shall consist of brick; stone, natural and textured cast stone; concrete masonry with integral color and texture (such as split rock faced concrete block) or with exterior surfaces that have been treated with a decorative applied, surface texture, and color other than paint; or cast in place concrete or pre-cast concrete panels.

Section 7. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards, Building Standards, "Accessory Buildings" is hereby amended to add #4 to read as follows:

4. No more than two accessory buildings may be placed on a lot and the total area of accessory buildings cannot exceed 30% of the building footprint of the principal structure.

Section 8. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards, Parking/Landscaping, "Landscaping" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Landscaping: Commercial, industrial, public, semi-public, institutional, multiple family residential, parking lots for five (5) or more vehicles and utility uses shall be required to submit a site landscape plan for approval by the City prior to issuance of a building permit. In all districts, the lot area remaining after providing for off-street parking, sidewalks, driveways, building sites and other requirements shall be planted and maintained in grass, sodding, shrubs or other acceptable vegetation generally used in landscaping and presented with a landscaping plan prior

to the issuance of any site plan approval and/or building permit. Said landscape plan shall be developed by a nurseryman or landscape professional and demonstrate an emphasis upon the boundary or perimeter of the proposed site at points adjoining a public right-of-way, other property, and the immediate perimeter of the structure. The landscaping shall be installed prior to issuance of any certificate of occupancy. At least 25% of commercially or industrially zoned lots (other than in the Canopy District) must be landscaped open space. This yard shall be kept clear of all structures, storage, and off-street parking. On the street facing side(s) of any structure there shall be foundation plantings with decorative mulch, rock, or similar. Such plantings shall include, at a minimum, ornamental low shrubs at least 18" in height with one planted every 20 feet of building façade. Except for driveways, the yard shall extend along the entire frontage of the lot, and along both streets in the case of a corner lot. Commercial, industrial, and institutional sites shall contain at a minimum the greater of one (1) tree per 1,000 square feet of gross building floor area, or one (1) tree per 50 lineal feet of site perimeter.*

Section 9. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Commercial/Industrial Performance Standards, Exterior Storage/Screening/Fences, "Screening/Exterior Storage" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Screening/Exterior Storage: No exterior storage is allowed other than as shown on a site plan approved by the City Council. All approved exterior storage-shall be located in the rear yard and screened. Screening may consist of a fence, trees, shrubs and berms, but shall not extend within 15 feet of any street for driveway. The screening shall be placed along property lines or in case of screening along a street, 20 feet from the street right-of-way with landscaping between the screening and pavement. Planting of a type approved by the City Council may also be required in addition to or in lieu of fencing.

Section 10. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Exterior Storage/Screening/Fences, "Trash Enclosures" is hereby added following "Screening/Exterior Storage" to read as follows:

Trash enclosures: Industrial, commercial, and institutional uses must provide trash enclosures for any waste containers that contain refuse and recyclable material or equipment that meet the following standards:

- 1. Trash enclosures located in the rear or side yards shall meet all applicable accessory building setback requirements.
- 2. Trash enclosures for waste containers must fully screen the containers from view from adjacent properties and the public right-of-way.
- 3. Trash enclosures must be constructed in a manner to resemble a screening fence or with architectural elements (type, quality, and appearance) similar to the principal structure.
- 4. Trash enclosures shall be located in an accessible location for pick-up vehicles.

Section 11. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.49, Exterior Storage/Screening/Fences, "Fences" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Fences: Fences shall not exceed 8 feet in height in any commercial or industrial district. Fences

shall be located not less than 18 inches from any lot line, except that fences may be located on the property line with written permission from the adjoining property owner, and except that a 3 foot setback is required from any street or alley right of way. Fences shall be constructed of wood, vinyl, wrought iron, chain link, or similar. Barbed wire or similar is prohibited.

Section 12. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.50.6 is hereby added to read as follows:

6. Parking in the C-1 District. Except for residential uses, the minimum amount of parking required shall not apply within the C-1 District. For residential uses within the Canopy District portion of the C-1, there shall be provided a minimum of one parking stall per bedroom up to two parking stalls per unit with no garage or guest parking required.

Section 13. This ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 391

AMENDING THE NATURAL RESOURCE PROTECTION ORDINANCE

The Council of the City of Annandale, Minnesota does hereby ordain:

Section 1. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.205 shall be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 152.205 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS.

It is recognized that this Chapter is structured to regulate development within natural resource areas of the City of Annandale. This Chapter is to accommodate all proposals within and around those areas by providing City input prior to the submission of a concept plan. The following are the minimum requirements which must be met before the City will approve a development proposal:

- 1. A general Natural Resources Protection and Mitigation Plan shall be submitted with an application for any concept illustrating the general location of natural resources, which natural resources are to be preserved, which natural resources are to be removed, and where the mitigation will occur within the property. The plan shall include the following:
 - a. Base mapping at a scale of 1'' = 100' (one inch equals 100 feet)
 - b. A mapped resource inventory that includes:
 - 1) Topographic contours at 10-foot intervals;
 - 2) Hydrologic characteristics, including surface water bodies, floodplains, wetlands, natural swales and drainageways
 - 3) Vegetation present on the site according to cover type (pasture, woodland, etc.)
 - 4) Current land use including all buildings and structures.
 - c. A site analysis that identifies, precisely locates, and calculates the acreage of all natural resource areas
 - d. Net developable acreage and allowed gross density
 - e. Street and open space concept
 - f. Building setbacks
 - g. Parcel lines and building placement concepts for residential

and accessory buildings

- h.Natural resource and tree protection plan
- i. Landscape plan
- i. Utility easements
- 2. A final Natural Resources Protection and Mitigation Plan shall be submitted with an application for preliminary plat illustrating the location of natural resources, which natural resources are to be preserved, which natural resources are to be removed, and where the mitigation will occur within the property. The plan shall include the following:
 - a. Base mapping at a scale of 1'' = 100' (one inch equals 100 feet)
 - b. A mapped resource inventory that includes:
 - 1) Topographic contours at 2-foot intervals;
 - 2) Hydrologic characteristics, including surface water bodies, floodplains, delineated wetlands, natural swales and drainageways
 - 3) Vegetation present on the site according to cover type (pasture, woodland, etc.)
 - 4) Current land use including all buildings and structures.
 - c. A site analysis that identifies, precisely locates, and calculates the acreage of all natural resource areas
 - d. Net developable acreage and allowed gross density
 - e. Street and open space concept
 - f. Building setbacks
 - g. Parcel lines and building placement concepts for residential and accessory buildings
 - k. Natural resource and tree preservation/protection plan
 - 1. Landscape plan
 - m. Utility easements

Section 2. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.206, Definitions shall be amended to delete the definitions of Bluff; Bluff Impact Zone; Buffer, Shore; Lake; Natural Resource Protection Standard; Pond; Shorelands; Toe of the Bluff; Top of the Bluff; Wetland, Shoreland; Woodland, Mature; and Woodland, Young.

Section 3. Zoning Ordinance Section 150.207 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 152.207 RESIDENTIAL AND NON-RESIDENTIAL REQUIREMENT AND EXCLUSIONS

- 1. Recognition of Natural Resource Features. This Ordinance recognizes that landforms, parcel size and shape, and natural resource features vary from site to site and that development regulations must take into account these variations. The maximum density or intensity of use allowed in any zoning district is controlled by the various district standards set forth for each of the various zoning districts of this Ordinance, or where applicable district standards can be altered by a PUD for cluster development.
- **Exclusions.** The tree preservation and replacement requirements are not required for minor subdivisions or non-residential subdivisions.

Section 4. Zoning Ordinance Section 152.208 is hereby amended to read as follows:

152.208 NATURAL RESOURCE PROTECTION STANDARDS

- 1. Natural Resources to be Protected under this Division to Remain Undisturbed and in a Natural State. All the natural resources required to be protected under this Section shall remain undisturbed and in a natural state except those natural resources where mitigation is in strict accord with requirements set forth in this Ordinance.
- **2.** Clear Cutting and Destruction of Existing Natural Resources. All clear cutting and destruction of natural resource features shall:
 - a. Be required to meet the protection levels described in this Ordinance or other relevant statutes.
 - b. Where such clear cutting and/or destruction violations occur, shall be required to meet the mitigations standards set forth in this Ordinance.

3. Tree Protection and Preservation.

- a. Affected areas. The following process for protecting significant trees (8" DBH) shall be required for all new residential subdivisions except for minor subdivisions.
- b. Tree Inventory. A tree inventory and survey shall be provided that includes all trees greater than 8 inches in diameter at breast height.
- c. Tree Protection. Subdividers are required to protect at minimum thirty (30) percent of the inches of existing significant trees on the property.

- d. Mitigation Standards. Tree removal that goes beyond the allowed 30 percent shall be mitigated by tree replacement as required in Section 150.210.
- **Wetlands and Wetland Buffers**. Wetland and wetland buffer area shall be determined by reference to the following sources shown below:
 - a. Under the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act and the Corps of Engineers Section 404 Program, delineations are conducted using the 1987 United States Army Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual (caution: large file). Delineations using this manual are prepared on the basis of field work, taking into account the three parameters of soils, hydrology, and vegetation. Under the DNR Public Waters Permit Program, the jurisdictional boundary of a wetland is the Ordinary High Water Level (OHWL). Information on determining the OHWL can be found in "Guidelines for Ordinary High Water Level (OHWL) Determinations," Minn. Department of Natural Resources (1993).
 - b. All wetland buffers shall not be less than thirty (30) feet.
 - c. No structures may be placed within wetlands or wetland buffers.
 - d. Any subdivisions shall result in all wetland and wetland buffers being placed within easements.
 - e. All residential subdivisions, except minor subdivisions, shall result in a wetland buffer planting plan where appropriate vegetation is placed within the required wetland buffer.

Section 5. Zoning Ordinance Section 152.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 152.210 NATURAL RESOURCE FEATURES MITIGATION

- 1. <u>Intent of Mitigation</u>. The City of Annandale recognizes that, under certain circumstances, property owners and developers may wish to develop in portions of those protected natural resources areas. In this section the conditions for mitigation and mitigation standards are set forth for the various natural resource features for which mitigation is allowed. The intent of this Section is not to permit greater destruction of natural resources than is permitted under the requirements of this Ordinance for typical property or development. This Section sets specific standards for use when the extent of the natural resources on a site and the use of the regulations would create a major hardship for said natural resource feature protection.
- **Mitigation Standards**. The following methods, requirements, standards and/or criteria shall be followed for the mitigation of those natural resource features that may be mitigated and as determined by the City Council.
 - a. Tree Preservation and Replacement.

- The applicant shall submit a Tree Preservation Plan illustrating all trees on the tree inventory superimposed on the grading plan. The Plan shall illustrate which trees shall be preserved and which trees shall be removed. The landscape plan shall show the existing and proposed planting of new trees. The tree preservation plan shall include a table of all trees on site being preserved and all trees being removed with the species and DBH of the trees.
- Tree removal shall not exceed 70 percent of total inches of trees 8" DBH or greater without replacement of the inches removed over 70 percent. A tree preservation plan that includes removal of inches greater than 70 percent, a landscaping plan shall be submitted depicting replacement of trees at 1" for every 1" of removal over 70 percent. Said plantings shall be in excess of any other tree planting requirements found in this ordinance.
- When determining the location of improvements within a new residential or non-residential development and the location of structures on parcels or lots, every reasonable effort shall be made to protect and preserve healthy trees having a diameter of eight (8) inches or greater. For healthy trees to be preserved not located in areas designated for a proposed building(s), circulation area, or parking area, the following measures shall be taken:
 - a) Site grading and construction equipment shall not encroach within the tree's drip line. No soil is to be removed from within one (1) foot of the drip line of an existing tree to be preserved.
 - b) Crushed stone or any other materials which may be detrimental to the tree shall not be dumped or stored within a tree's drip line or at any other such location where the drainage from said stone or materials would be directed towards the tree.
 - c) In the case of healthy trees to be preserved, a snow fence shall be installed on the periphery of the tree's drip line during construction in order to help assure the continual protection of the tree during construction.
 - d) No attachment or wires, other than those of a protective or nondamaging nature, shall be attached to any existing tree(s) during construction.
 - e) If possible, and in order to avoid destruction or razing, existing trees which are eight (8) inches or less in diameter at breast height may be relocated and replanted on a parcel or lot. All such trees which are relocated shall be maintained alive and healthy on the parcel or lot. Any

such trees which die shall be replaced by the developer. The developer shall be required by the City Council to post a letter of credit to assure tree replacement if the trees die within a period of two years.

- f) In the event that a tree designated on any approved plan for preservation is destroyed or razed during the construction process, said tree shall be replaced by the developer with a species as set forth by the requirements of the City and in conformance with the size and number requirements of this Ordinance. If the tree razed is between 8" and 11" DBH the replacement shall be 1.5" for every 1" removed. If the DBH is greater than 11" the replacement shall be 2" for every 1" removed.
- g) The developer shall be required by the City Council to post a letter of credit to assure tree replacement.
- 4) Locations where it may be impossible to plant the minimum requirement of replacement trees, the applicant may pay a fee in the equivalent of the amount of money to plant said trees to the City's Park Dedication Fund. Such payment shall be in excess of any other park dedication requirements.
- 5) All replacement trees shall be, at minimum, 2" in DBH at the time of planting. The following trees are acceptable for the purpose of replacement trees:

6) A minimum of 10 percent up to a maximum 25 percent of all replacement trees shall be coniferous trees a minimum of 4' in height, which will be counted as 2" of replacement trees.

b. Wetlands and Wetland Buffer. The required wetland protection standards may be mitigated only if such reduction/mitigation is part of the City Engineer's approved Stormwater Management Plan and consistent with all other requirements. In addition, a permit from the US Army Corps of Engineers pursuant to the requirements of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1344) shall be submitted to the City of Annandale certifying that filling has been approved and permitted by the Corps, as a condition of City review. If a MN DNR water quality certification is needed, a copy of said certification shall be provided to the City.

Section 6. Zoning Ordinance Sections 152.202, 152.209, 152.211, and 152.212 are hereby deleted. The remaining ordinance sections shall be recodified and renumbered.

Section 7. This ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and publication.

BACKGROUND:

The City will receive approximately \$380k from the ARPA Funds. These funds can be used similar to how the CRF money could be used, but they added additional costs associated with Sewer/Water projects, Broadband Projects and Revenue Loss. Attached is a summary of the final rule on eligible uses.

Under the final rule, the calculation of revenue loss states the following: "Treasury is permitting recipients to determine the amount of revenue lost due to the pandemic either according to a formula or by claiming a standard allowance of up to \$10 million, not to exceed their total award allocation." Based on this information, the City could opt to elect the standard allowance for the full amount of our allocation and be in compliance.

LMC provided a draft resolution to elect the standard allowance- see attached. Staff is recommending approval of the attached Resolution. This approach will minimize the red tape with reporting and accountability for the expenditures under other eligible projects.

WHEREAS, Congress adopted the American Rescue Plan Act in March 2021 ("ARPA") which included \$65 billion in recovery funds for cities across the country.

WHEREAS, ARPA funds are intended to provide support to state, local, and tribal governments in responding to the impact of COVID-19 and in their efforts to contain COVID-19 in their communities, residents, and businesses.

WHEREAS, The Fiscal Recovery Funds provides for \$19.53 billion in payments to be made to States and territories which will distribute the funds to nonentitlement units of local government (NEUs).

WHEREAS, The ARPA requires that States and territories allocate funding to NEUs in an amount that bears the same proportion as the population of the NEU bears to the total population of all NEUs in the State or territory.

WHEREAS, approximately \$_____ has been allocated to the City of Annandale ("City") pursuant to the ARPA.

WHEREAS, The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds ensures that governments have the resources needed to fight the pandemic and support families and businesses struggling with its public health and economic impacts, maintain vital public services, even amid declines in revenue, and build a strong, resilient, and equitable recovery by making investments that support long-term growth and opportunity.

WHEREAS, In May 2021, the US Department of Treasury ("Treasury") published the Interim Final Rule describing eligible and ineligible uses of funds as well as other program provisions, sought feedback from the public on these program rules, and began to distribute funds.

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2022, Treasury issued the final rule. The final rule delivers broader flexibility and greater simplicity in the program, responsive to feedback in the comment process.

WHEREAS, the final rule offers a standard allowance for revenue loss of up to \$10 million, allowing recipients to select between a standard amount of revenue loss or complete a full revenue loss calculation.

WHEREAS, recipients that select the standard allowance may use that amount, in many cases their full award, for government services, with streamlined reporting requirements.
